



**Exodus 17:8-13 (also see Joshua 10:11-14)**

What was the key to Joshua's success as a military leader of God's people?

**Exodus 24:12-14; 32:15-19; 33:11**

What experiences in these passages may have helped prepare Joshua for a role of leadership among the people? How?

**Numbers 14:5-10, 20-30; 32:10-12**

Why do Joshua and Caleb react differently than the other men chosen to spy out the land? What does this show us about their spirit / character? Why is this vital to the role of a leader?

**Numbers 27:15-23**

Why is Joshua chosen to follow Moses as the next leader of God's people? How is this leadership role described?

**Joshua 1:1-9**

What are the main pieces of counsel that Joshua needs as he begins his role as a leader of God's people?

**Joshua 1:16-18**

How do the people respond to Joshua's leadership? Why do they respect his authority?

**Joshua 5:13-14**

What lesson is God teaching Joshua through this experience?

**Joshua 8:30-35**

Was Joshua's leadership of the people only demonstrated through military command? What does he do to effectively shepherd God's people in this passage?

**Joshua 7:22-26**

How does Joshua deal with rebellious sin among God's people? Why is this important to his role as a leader?

**Joshua 10:24-27**

How does Joshua respond to this military success? Why would this be helpful in his continued leadership of God's people?

**Joshua 18:1-10**

How does Joshua handle the need to apportion the land to these remaining 7 tribes? What positive qualities of leadership does this reflect?

**Joshua 23:1-13; 24:22-27**

What are the main pieces of counsel that Joshua wants to leave the people of Israel with before he dies? What else does he do to encourage their faithfulness beyond his own lifetime?
