What type of sin is described that needs to be addressed in this passage? (**vv. 1, 11**)

What does Paul say the Corinthians' attitude about this sin should be? (**v. 2**) What was preventing them from such an attitude? (**vv. 2, 6**)

What action needed to be taken by the church? How is this described and what can we learn from these descriptions? (**vv. 2-3,5,7,11-13**)

By whose authority were such actions to be taken? (**v. 4**)

What 2 purposes for this action are mentioned? (**v. 5 / vv. 6-8**)

**2 Thess 3:6-15**

How is the sinning brother addressed in this passage described? (vv. 6,11-12,14)

What is to be done if he does not obey divine revelation and continues to live an unruly life? (vv. 6,14-15)

What is the intention of such actions? (v. 14)

What should be our attitude towards such a brother? Does not associating with him mean cutting off communications? (v. 15)

**1 Tim 1:18-20; 2 Tim 2:16-18; 4:14-15**

How is the spiritual condition of these men described?

What actions does Paul say he took towards these men? What does this mean? What was the purpose of such actions? (1 Tim 1:20)

What instructions does Paul give to Timothy regarding these men? What was the purpose of these instructions? (2 Tim 2:16-17; 4:15)

**Rom 16:16-20; 2 John 7-11**

What kind of influences are we warned against in these passages?

What actions are we instructed to take towards those who are spreading this type of influence?
