CHAPTERS 19-20

Praise at the Harlot's Judgment and the Bride's Preparation – 19:1-10

What group expresses the first "hallelujah"? What is the reason for their praise?

What is added in their second "hallelujah"? Is this a legitimate reason to worship God? Why?

Who expresses the third "hallelujah"? Who is then urged to join in for the fourth "hallelujah"?

What reasons are given for their praise and gladness?

What is symbolized by the bride and her clothing? Who is she being contrasted to? (v. 2; 17:4)

What is John told to write? What does this event symbolize?

What is John's reaction to all of this? How is he corrected?

Christ and His Army Proceed From Heaven - 19:11-16

Who enters from heaven? How is His appearance described?

What four names or titles is He given? (vv. 11, 12, 13, 16)

What has He come to do? (vv. 11, 15) Who is following Him in this mission and how are they described? (v. 14)

The Beast and False Prophet are Defeat and Their Army Devoured – 19:17-21

In contrast to the marriage supper of the Lamb (v. g), what second supper is introduced here? Who is invited and what will they be feasting upon?

What happens to the army assembled to make war against Christ and His followers? What becomes of their two leaders? How are the rest defeated and destroyed?

Satan is Bound and the Faithful Reign 1,000 Years – 20:1-6

From whom did the beast and false prophet get their power and authority? (13:2, 12) Will he be immediately destroyed with the beast and false prophet? What will happen to him and for how long?

In the meantime, what happens to those who had been faithful unto death? (compare 6:9-11)

What is this experience called and how are those who take part in it blessed? (parallel 5:10)

Satan's Defeat and Final Judgment - 20:7-15

What happens when Satan is released? Who joins him to make war with the saints? (compare Ezek 38-39)

What happens to this numerous army? What then happens to Satan?

After all foes have been defeated, what final event will take place? How is the reaction of earth and heaven described as they face God's throne?

In what way will all people be judged? What books are involved in this judgment?

How is the place of eternal judgment described? What and whom are cast into this place?
